

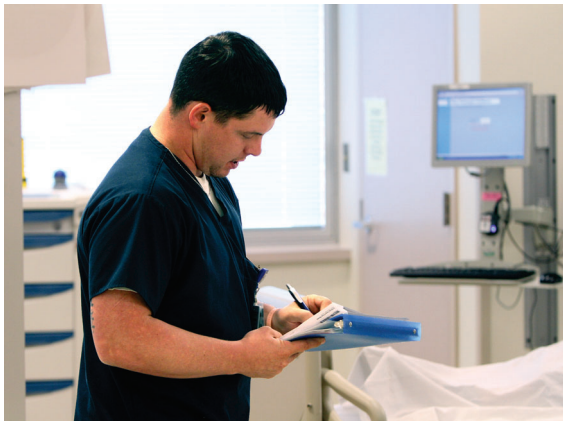
Bachelor of Science in Nursing -BSN

UMW's Bachelor of Nursing Degree Completion Program prepares graduates to identify and improve patient care within a complex healthcare system, to assume more vital roles within the medical profession, and to continue their nursing education.



The BSN Completion Program teaches registered nurses concepts related to clinical reasoning, critical thinking, cultural sensitivity, evidence-based practice, genetics and genomics, informatics, inter-professional teams, life-long learning, patient-centered care, patient safety, professionalism, quality improvement, and practice across the lifespan.

Your Career Focused Education

The program is for graduates with an associate degree or hospital diploma programs who hold an RN license in Virginia and who wish to gain a Bachelor of Science in Nursing. Applicants must have attained a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale in undergraduate study. Applicants who earned a GPA lower than 3.0 may be considered with additional documentation.

BSN PROGRAM:

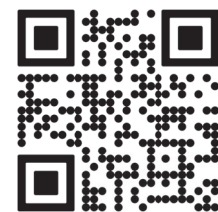
- 30 credits
