

The Psychological Science Program

The University of Mary Washington's Department of Psychological Science offers a future-focused curriculum taught by engaging faculty in updated facilities.

- Courses in general psychology, statistics, and research methods prepare you for scholarship steeped in critical thinking.
- Content courses explore the core areas of psychology - development, cognition, clinical, biological and human diversity. You might study topics such as learning and motivation, aging neuroscience, psychopharmacology, and cultural psychology.
- Elective courses include forensic psychology, positive psychology, health psychology, and sport psychology.
- Research seminar topics have included personality and social media, trauma and sexual assault, helicopter parenting, objectification and body image, and animal learning.
- Individual research experiences with faculty have included study of:
 - Memory in context
 - Stress-induced eating
 - Spatial learning in animals
 - Attitudes toward the environment
 - Sleep deprivation effects
- Internships and community service learning help you meet major requirements while gaining professional experience.

- You'll study with 12 full-time faculty, nationally and internationally recognized in their fields.
- They're authorities on human memory, romantic relationships, mindfulness, eating behaviors, trauma, feminism, sleep, and effective parenting.

- All students do at least one research project as part of the major.
- · All students can collaborate with faculty mentors on innovative research.
- In the last few years, more than 40 students have teamed up with faculty to publish articles in peer-reviewed journals, and more than 100 students have presented papers at national conferences.
- Many students receive funding to attend the Virginia Association for Psychological Science conference and other regional meetings.
