COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course is aimed at teachers of Spanish as a foreign language in the U.S.A. and Canada in general, teachers in bilingual, immersion and Spanish-for-native-speakers programs, grades K-12, and Community College teachers.

It is designed for those teachers of Spanish seeking to increase their teaching resources through a dynamic immersion experience in the Spanish social and cultural context. Class activities, which will be very practical and full of academic content, will be implemented by other out-of-the-classroom activities (such as visits to landmarks and popular festivals) that will allow teachers to get to know the reality of Spanish culture and society at first hand.

Language and culture are two sides of the same coin. For that reason, the course will show not only some of the most relevant theoretical aspects of Spanish culture, but also the way in which history, art, politics, music, traditions, festivities... can make interesting teaching proposals in the Spanish class.

The course consists of the following sections:

1. Aspects of Spanish Language and its Teaching

An in-depth approach to the knowledge and use of the Spanish language through practical principles and exercises, and the analysis of their teaching according to different methodologies. Special emphasis will be made on grammar aspects problematic for native speakers of English.

2. Multicultural Spain

An approach to the knowledge of the Spanish regional variety, characterized by its cross-cultural nature, and also of its society by means of dynamic activities in and out of the classroom.

3. Teaching Resources for the Classroom

Aimed at teachers wishing to explore up-to-date teaching resources in different formats in order to use them in their classrooms: cinema, literature, press, audiovisuals...

4. New technologies in the Spanish Language Classroom

Guidelines for the integration of technologies in the Spanish language classroom in an effective, fun and easy way.

5. Oral Spanish Workshop

Intensive practice of the spoken language for the improvement of the oral skill of Spanish teachers. Based in the conversation exchange with instructors of the University of Deusto.

COURSE GOALS

- To update the knowledge of Spanish teachers from a linguistic, cultural and methodological point of view.
- To provide teachers with useful teaching resources and materials for their classes.
- To offer teachers the chance to get to know current Spanish culture at first hand, both in and outside the classroom.
- To contribute to the linguistic training of Spanish teachers, with a special emphasis on the natural use of Spanish in daily life.
