

Major Portfolio Requirements

A strong art portfolio and good writing skills are essential for the professional artist. The Studio Art program seeks to strengthen these skills, assessing your development as an artist from the moment you declare the major and upon completion of your senior exhibition.

The Studio Art Assessment Program is a two-phase system. First, the faculty seek to document student artwork by requiring a Major Portfolio for newly declared studio art majors. A final assessment evaluates the work from your Senior Exhibition and your Artist Statement.

**The Major Portfolio is your entrance into ARTS 474 and your Senior Exhibition.*

Major Portfolio Submission Information: this should be completed as soon as you declare the major. Do not worry about the level or quality of your work; it is the goal of the program to document your “entry-level” work and assist you as you develop through the major. The portfolio consists of 8-10 printed thumbnail images of artwork completed in our program. It can be from 100-200 level courses and should be accompanied by an image list. When listing examples of sound or video art you may also include a link to the work on an external streaming site (Vimeo, YouTube, Soundcloud, etc) in addition to the thumbnail.
