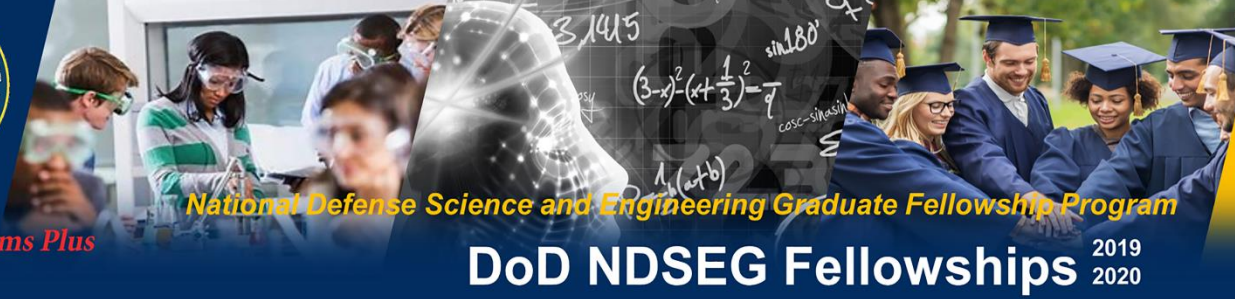

FY2020 National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate Fellowship Program Application Period: 4 September – 6 December 2019

The DoD National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate (NDSEG) Fellowship Program was established in 1989 by direction of Congress and sponsored by the Army, Navy and Air Force.

The Fellowship serves as a means of increasing the number of U.S. citizens trained in science and engineering disciplines of military importance. The program is a highly competitive fellowship awarded to qualified U.S. citizens, U.S. nationals, and U.S. dual citizens who intend to pursue a Doctoral degree, aligned to the DoD Broad Agency Announcements (BAAs), at a U.S. institution of their choice.

The Fellowship pays for full tuition and all mandatory fees, a monthly stipend, travel, and health insurance

An applicant's degree program must align with the following broad research area disciplines:



The Government may revise the aforementioned disciplines annually to ensure relevancy to the Defense mission is maintained

- Physics (Including Optics)
- Biosciences (Includes Toxicology)
- Cognitive, Neural, And Behavioral Sciences
- Oceanography (Includes Ocean Acoustics, Remote Sensing, And Marine Meteorology)

- Chemical Engineering
- Materials Science and Engineering
- Computer and Computational Sciences
- Geosciences (Includes Terrain, Water, And Air)
- Naval Architecture and Ocean Engineering (Includes Undersea Systems)



Applications are encouraged from women, persons with disabilities and minorities, including members of ethnic minority groups such as Native American, African American, Hispanic American, Native Alaskan (Eskimo and Aleut) or Pacific Islander (Polynesian or Micronesian).
