Additional Details:

Use Master's + category for anyone with work beyond a Master's degree but who is short of an earned terminal degree. Terminal degree is determined by the expectations for the subject taught (JD would be a terminal degree for teaching law classes, MFA is terminal for studio art, creative writing, theatre performance, etc.). For persons with other than a doctorate degree, the judgment that the degree is a terminal one must be based on accepted disciplinary standards and approved as a terminal degree by both the College Dean and the Provost.

The "top tier" is for UMW *emeriti* or other adjuncts with recognized distinguished credentials (noteworthy professional standing in their field, a significant publication record, etc.). Persons other than UMW *emeriti* who are placed in this category must be approved by the College Dean and the Provost.

"Graded college-level course" means the individual was the instructor of record and assigned grades. Labs taught alone (without the corresponding lecture) count as one-half a course.
